DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

"OUR QUESTIONS AND OUR ANSWERS"

Passover is soon upon us and with all the preparation and arrangements about "where we will be for the seder", we might want to consider our questions and our answers. It is significant that our Passover text is our Hagaddah, a Hebrew word that means our "telling". We tell our children on that day what God did for us when we left Egypt. But then again, it's not all in the telling. There are the Passover questions.

The most well-known moment in the seder is the "Mah Nishtanah", the asking of the four questions. Questions are basic to our seder, just as they are central to Pesah and to Jewish living itself. It might very well be the case that the first Passover ritual, the dipping of karpas, or parsley, into salt water, was inserted into our seder for no other reason than to spur us on to ask more questions, better questions.

There is a national Jewish organization, Clal, that for over two decades has tried to bring Jews together from the entire spectrum of Jewish thought, observance, and orientation. Each year Clal publishes a small pamphlet on one aspect of Pesah. This year's publication emphasizes our four questions. The writers state that the first two questions of the Mah Nishtanah call our attention to oppression and tragedy...the bread of affliction and the bitter herbs. Perhaps the first two questions challenge us to consider fresh ways as to how we see the painful events that confront us today. The second two questions mention the customs of dipping twice and reclining. These references, according to the writers, highlight the good things that we have in our lives. What questions might we ask ourselves and others so that we might show a greater understanding and appreciation for the blessings of our lives?

Pesah is all about questions and all about answers. Our children's questions and our own questions are significant. The questions shape the nature of the answers we give. God willing, both our questions and our answers this Pesah will make for a better world, a world more worthy of God's redemption. I pray that this Passover we will ask good questions and that our answers will lead to ways in which we will help our people, Israel, and all those in need. May you and your loved ones enjoy Pesah in good health. I look forward to seeing you at the Passover Freedom Service and Congregational Seder on Tuesday, April 6th.

was snatched away from her as she and millions of other Jews
were subjected to the terrors of the Holocaust. She tells her
story as if it were a photo album... a string of memory pictures
that paint an unforgettable landscape of happiness and horror.
She brings her audiences into the heart, mind, and soul of a
child who suffered and survived one of the cruelest episodes in
human history. Eva lost her entire family, thus feeling like she
was "left behind".

In spite of this, Eva has an incredibly positive attitude toward
humanity and this is what comes across in her presentation.

She has written a book and participated in the making of a
movie about her story. We hope to have the English version of
the book on sale at this event. The movie will be shown after
the conclusion of the program.
