"A TIME TO PREPARE"

For well over a year there has been an effort in our city and state to encourage all our citizens to address end of life issues with their loved ones. Without going into all the reasons for this, end of life care is difficult at best and can be excruciating when individuals and families are ill prepared. There is a local "end of life" initiative entitled, "Toward a Better Ending" that has received national recognition. Various conferences, learning sessions, and meetings have taken place in Worcester and throughout the commonwealth during the past several months. Recently our president, Michael Wolpert, and I attended one of the training sessions on end of life issues. On Friday, May 28, at 8:00 we will hold a Compassion Shabbat with a discussion on the importance and sanctity of addressing some of the critical issues having to do with end of life care for ourselves and our loved ones. Later there will be further information regarding Compassion Shabbat.

One of the most important resource materials available for Jews on this topic is a newly revised book entitled, A Time to Prepare, published by the Union for Reform Judaism's Department of Bioethics and Family Concerns. The book, which retails for \$15.00, covers a host of medical, legal, and ethical issues ranging from advance directives, health care proxies and wills to ethical wills and issues of spiritual concern. I find the book so important for the members of our congregation that we undertook the initiative to raise the funds so that each family unit in our congregation can have a copy at no cost to themselves.

During the entire month of February you will be able to peruse sample copies available in the library or from our Temple staff members: Cantor Metzger, June Willey, Wendy Wong and myself. ***I am asking one member from each family simply to notify the temple office during the month of February whether they do or do not want the book.*** On Monday, March 1, 2004, I will call the Union for Reform Judaism and place the entire book order for all our members who told us they want the book. I urge you to respond in the affirmative that you wish to acquire the book and to fill out the various items listed as to what your own desires are regarding end of life matters. Most important, I urge you to have a discussion with family members and loved ones of the various concerns brought up in the book. Once the books are shipped and received in the Temple office, each member who ordered the book can come by the office and pick up a copy. No one knows what tomorrow brings. The time to prepare is now.

EIGHT GREAT JEWISH - AMERICAN PHOTOGRAPHERS

An Interview with Lewis Shepard

As an art historian, Lewis Shepard was intrigued by a question posed in an exhibit he saw at the Jewish Museum: "Is there something specifically Jewish about photography?"

"Maybe not," says Lewis, "But it just so happens that many of the great American and European photographers have been Jewish" He'll be showing images of several during his Joy of Judaism session February 29th. "Photography is the most pervasive and perhaps the most persuasive art form. There is something about a still photograph that stays with you," he noted. "If you look at a lot of great photos, you develop a vocabulary of images that you can use for inspiration and comparison."

Asked if he takes photos himself Lewis says, "I do. They are mostly documentary, but I like to think that once a year I take a picture that's worth framing and hanging on the wall."

"Poetry is a very condensed form," Richard said. "It is less accessible than other writing. You have to work to understand it." Speaking for myself, I'm very excited about the opportunity to hear poetry from the mouths of its makers!

Last Purim, for the first time in Temple Sinai history, most of *Megillat Esther* was read. We had an adult group of six and the ceremony was spiritual, uplifting and just plain wonderful. Most of the participants from last year are planning to do this again. We will be chanting a good portion of the Megillah on Sunday morning, March 7 at 9:00 AM.

Speaking of Purim, the 5th grade will be participating in the Purim Spiel on Sunday, March 7, 2004 at 10 AM. They will be presenting *A Beatles Purim*. In early February, the Chanters will get to make their own tie-dye shirts for the play. (I'm going to make one for myself as well!) This class is very musical, and I anticipate an outstanding production. The story is the original Megillah with Beatles favorites including: *Got to get you into my life, With a little help from my friends, Let it be, Yesterday, Help, and Ob-la-di*. There will also be a "Bandstand" backup singing group, and a live band to help the students with the feel. This is a great class, and I look forward to working with them on this project.

I have offered classes in chanting Megillat Esther and Haftarah. Since the congregation reads Torah every Friday night, we are always looking for people who would like to chant the weekly Torah portion (6-10 verses is average). I am always happy to supply a tape if anyone needs it, but I was thinking that it might be nice to have a "core" of Torah chanters. If you think you might be interested in this, please call me, and I'll arrange to teach a class in Torah trope.

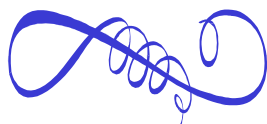

WORCESTER INTERFAITH HOSPITALITY AT TEMPLE SINAI

Temple Sinai successfully hosted the Worcester Interfaith Hospitality Families from December 14 - 28. The Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN) is a charitable organization located at 114 Main Street in Worcester, MA. The IHN unites the religious community in an effort to nurture homeless families. The congregations host several homeless families overnight and volunteers from the congregations provide the evening meal, and stay overnight with them. Temple Sinai hosted a family consisting of a mother and a father, a 9 year-old girl, a 6 year-old girl, and a 5 year-old boy. The mother delivered a baby girl on Monday December 22. The father in this family does work and they have health insurance. They have now moved into their own apartment in Worcester. After the baby was born, we at Temple Sinai successfully raised enough money for this family to stay at the Best Western for several nights and they were able to have dinner each night. The last night, when their apartment was not ready for them on the date planned, St John's Episcopal Church on Holden Street in Worcester picked up the cost for their last night at the hotel and their dinner.

Through donations of either funds or actual items, we have been able to provide this family with diapers, Worcester trash bags, crib sheets, blankets, and baby clothes now that they are at their apartment. June's daughter Marcia very generously donated a stroller and a snugly and clothes for this family.
