"JEWISH NUMBERS"

Not long ago the National Jewish Population Study was published and the study suffered a major setback at the time of its release. According to the statisticians, the percentages were accurate, but not the raw numbers. There was much concern whether or not the study was valid or even reliable. Regardless, the study gives us much to ponder. 42% of Reform Jews (the respondent defined his or her definition of "Reform") belong to synagogue and 82% of Reform Jews pray. For Jews of all denominations, those who pray and those who belong to synagogues are virtually in two different groups.

According to the study, what does it mean to be Jewish? Respondents said that being Jewish meant being connected to other people; upholding certain basic values such as tikun olam, ethics, tzedakah, belief in God, and having a rich spiritual life; and doing Jewish practices such as celebrating holidays, attending synagogue, and giving children a Jewish education. While one's commitment to take care of the world and to help the poor was the highest value, connection to Israel was the second highest value although it was only half as strong as the first. Tzedakah was a high value among all Jews, although Jews less than 40 years of age showed less of a commitment to tzedakah. Most Jews who stated they give tzedakah saw their act as a spiritual act. Those who did not regularly give tzedakah did not see tzedakah as a spiritual act.

There are many aspects of the study that need to be discussed and acted upon, not the least of which is the importance of Jewish education. Jewish continuity is inextricably connected with Jewish education. A significant finding in the study is that one fourth of all Jews feel a renewed interest in Judaism. For most Jews - even those in Central Massachusetts - the significant finding of the study is that the Jewish population is aging and shrinking. For me, Jewish vitality and not Jewish numbers, per se, insures that the Jewish faith continues into the future. To be sure we need a critical mass, but Jewish life thrives only when we use our imagination more, when we broaden our horizons and refuse to be paralyzed by fear and pessimism. Jewish vitality rises to the surface due to our vision and our willingness to share our enthusiasm and joy about being Jewish with others. The more creativity, the more Judaism. For Jews, it has always been that way and it always will be.

**JEWS IN JAZZ:
An Interview with Marty Friedman**

How did you get into jazz? I asked Marty Friedman one recent snowy evening. "When I was 17," he said, "I was into Hendrix and the Dead. I'd gone through all the rock albums at the New York City public library and was looking for something else. I spotted an LP with a picture of Coleman Hawkins blowing cigarette smoke through his nose, and I thought that was cool. So I listened to that album, and I was hooked. Went through all the jazz albums they had." Now Marty has a jazz show Sunday mornings from 8-12 on WICN and is playing in a band.

When we asked, he graciously agreed to do a session for the Joy of Judaism series called Jews in Jazz. I talked to Marty about his January 14th offering just after he'd finished a rehearsal with the band. What band, you might ask?

"Initially, I thought I'd do some research and give a 1-hour lecture and play some tapes and songs and that would be it," Marty said. "Then I said, wait a minute, I could bring my buddies and just play music. Music could be central."

So he's bringing a six or seven piece band that includes three Temple members: Jacob Gorodetsky on violin, Mike Whitman on keyboards, and Marty Friedman on guitar. They'll play four sets featuring the music of four Jewish American composers: Gershwin, Hammerstein, Rogers and Hart, and Kern.
