## DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

### "HELPING THE HUNGRY"

At this season, when one secular year folds into the next, perennially we are in the midst of reading the story of Joseph in our Torah cycle. When Joseph was the vizier under Pharaoh, he arranged that all excess food be sent to a central storage area, something like our Worcester Food Bank, for food to be doled out in time of need. The other way of handling hunger and famine is found in the book of Leviticus where each Israelite is instructed to "round the corner of one's field," thereby leaving excess food for those in need to glean. Either way, in the Torah we learn of our obligation to feed the hungry, a biblical notion later reinforced by the Prophets.

Rev. Tom McKibbens of First Baptist Church, on behalf of the Worcester Faith Community Hunger Initiative, recently circulated a letter to religious leaders stating in 2009 the number of people receiving emergency food assistance in our area increased 13% this year as opposed to last, from 82,000 to 93,000 people. Over one third of the hungry in our area are children.

At this time of the year when oil bills rise and people choose between paying for utilities and paying for food, may we all do more to combat hunger. Please consider "rounding the corner of your field" by giving personally to a local food pantry or organization that helps to feed those who are hungry. Should you choose to send an offering to the "central storage area," as it were, please send a check payable to the "Rabbi's Fund" and on the memo line, please write "Hunger Initiative." At the end of this month, on January 31, I will disperse half of the collected funds to Rachel's Table and the other half to the Worcester County Food Bank.

Each Yom Kippur, our most holy day of the year, we read the words of the Prophet Isaiah, "Is this the fast that God has chosen?" Maybe God is asking us to choose our fasts for our own spiritual purposes, but never to allow misfortune and dire circumstances to force a fast upon ourselves or other people. There is so much in our lives that we cannot control. When it comes to combating poverty and hunger, so much is in our hands to bring nourishment and healing into the lives of others. By our very actions, may 2010 be a year of goodness, peace and blessing for all those in our area.

Our library doesn't have it yet, but if someone would like to donate it, we would be very appreciative.)
