DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

"WHAT HAVE WE DONE TO HELP THE VICTIMS, LATELY?"

This bulletin arrives in your hands just as a new fiscal year begins and shortly before the summer season arrives. We spend the summer months preparing for a new synagogue year beginning in the fall. Summer holds many opportunities for relaxation and the replenishment of the body and soul. In the lassitude of summer, many of us take the much needed vacations and moments of repose that refresh our inner spirits. As we begin to prepare for the summer season we should keep in mind those who are having a most difficult time due to having become the victims of violence and trauma.

The list of victims of violence grows larger every day. At the end of June, I will be writing four checks to organizations that assist victims of violence. There are the victims of sexual and domestic abuse. No national organization, even supported by the Jewish community across the country, does more to combat domestic violence than the Center for the Prevention of Sexual and Domestic Violence in Washington, D.C. The Center is mostly responsible for bringing to our attention that domestic violence is a religious issue.

And then there is Israel. Terror Victims Association is Israel's first and most experienced organization, established by victims themselves in 1986 to provide support to victims from the moment of an attack through years of recovery. The Friends of Israel Disabled War Veterans, Beit Halochem, helps Israel's disabled war veterans win their toughest battle that hasn't ended: the battle of disability. Finally, there is the trauma center of Ha'emek Hospital in Worcester's sister city, Afula, Israel. The number of trauma victims treated by Haemek Hospital boggles the mind. These four organizations help victims of violence both here and Israel. For those who wish to donate to any or all of these organizations please let me know by Wednesday, June 30th. Wishing you a healthy, productive and spiritually fulfilling summer.
