## THE OMER - A COUNTDOWN TO SUMMER

Last week, as Temple Sinai's 10<sup>th</sup> graders publicly confirmed their ongoing commitment to Judaism, we began our observance of Shavuot – perhaps Judaism's most underrated and unappreciated holiday. This "Festival of Weeks" arrives seven weeks after Pesach, and marks *z'man matan Torateinu*, the day we received our Torah at Mount Sinai.

We traditionally count the Omer to accurately track the forty-nine days between Passover and Shavuot. The idea of counting each day represents spiritual preparation and anticipation for receiving the Torah on the fiftieth day, Shavuot. And for anyone concerned with the risk of forgetting to count, software from Penticon Technologies "makes it convenient to count the Omer on your Palm Pilot," and another company called "OmerBuddy" will send twice-daily SMS text-message reminders to your cell phone.

When this year's Omer count began in early April, Worcester lay in dormant hibernation, benumbed with cold and inhospitable grey gloom. But the passing of just fifty days (count 'em...) has delivered on nature's perpetual promise of rebirth. Perennials foliate with uncoiling blooms, polychrome annuals explode with dazzling color, and trees hatch a stippled clutch of tender infant leaves. Like Memorial Day in the secular world, Shavuot is the unofficial Jewish start of summer.

In ancient times, the first fruits of early summer were brought to Jerusalem on Shavuot, and Shavuot still coincides with the garden's siren song, beckoning us to come and plant. Morning fog burns off into brilliant sunshine, strawberries are ripe and luscious, and we decorate our homes and synagogues with green plants and beautiful roses. What a divine moment when that first whiff of lilacs drifts in through an open window!

If bulky clothing forms a suit of armor to fend off winter's belligerence, summer's looser attire liberates us to drink sensually from the world around us, to live in a heightened state of divine awareness. Garden compost, new babies, aromatic blossoms, ice cream, crickets, tall young graduates and lovers under the *chuppah*. Shavuot, the festival that kindles the summer sun, reminds us to stay up past the spent twilight to celebrate this languid-paced season *in the moment*. In celebrating Shavuot and absorbing the budding summer, we remember to be awake, to be actively thankful for the smaller details of a world we so often take for granted.

The slow march of the Omer count compels us to literally stop and smell the roses as spring progressively unfolds, new and miraculous, one day at a time. This patient journey of methodical counting also offers us a fitting metaphor of how Judaism and Jewish communities evolve through slow and steady forward motion. In June of 2007, this synagogue enters nature's season of rebirth with renewal of our own – responsibly improved financial management, measurably invigorated volunteerism and participation, and a spiritually uplifted practice of Judaism. Slow and steady, we count our progress, poised beautifully for our coming Jubilee year, Temple Sinai's 50th anniversary.

May your summer be safe, restful and filled with dazzling moments. (Go Red Sox).

## NOTES FROM ROBIN

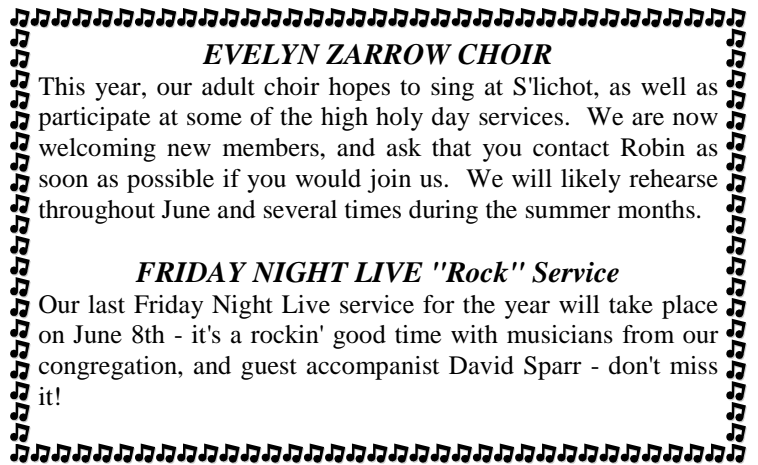
*After silence, that which comes nearest to expressing the inexpressible is music.*

***HaPinah HaYerukah (The Green Corner) - What Should Jews Be Doing About Global Warming?***

The American Jewish Committee aims to become one of the first Jewish non-profits in the U.S. to comply with the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Building Rating Systems at its national headquarters in New York. Five key areas of human and environmental health are touched on by the LEED performance standards: sustainable site development, water savings, energy efficiency, materials selection, and indoor environmental quality. To earn certification, a building must meet certain prerequisites and performance benchmarks, and perform above and beyond those requirements, to earn credits within each category.

For the purposes of LEED certification, AJC's headquarters, must maximize operational efficiency while minimizing environmental impacts. This system provides AJC with effective benchmarks for measuring upgrades, improvements and maintenance over the life of a building. AJC's programs include recycling, lighting reduction, green cleaning methods, fuel-efficient vehicle bonuses, renewable electricity purchases, mechanical systems upgrades, green purchasing policies

Poetic license permits the Green Corner to mention Mets right fielder and Jewish Sports Hall of Famer Shawn Green. Of Jewish major leaguers, only Hank Greenberg, with 331 home runs and 1,276 RBIs, has more major league home runs and RBIs than Green, and only Buddy Myer has more hits. It is noteworthy that Green's grandfather in fact shortened the family name from Greenberg to Green, for "business reasons." Before he was traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2000, Green put a remarkable condition on any trade – it would have to be to a city with a large Jewish population.
