## DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

### "RESPONDING TO ANTISEMITISM"

The idea of anti-semitism appears twice in the Hebrew Bible. Two times hatred is projected upon our people simply because we are Jewish. The first instance occurs early in the book of Exodus (1:9-10a), when the Egyptians say, "Look, the Israelite people are much too numerous for us. Let us deal shrewdly with them." Secondly, in the book of Esther (3:8-9), Haman declares, "There is a certain people scattered abroad and dispersed among the peoples and their laws are diverse from those of every people; neither do Jews keep the laws of the land; therefore Jews should not be suffered and should be destroyed." While we will delight - as we should - in the story of Esther at Purim on March 7<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m., anti-semitism is not always mere child's play.

Anti-Semitic charges are being leveled against the new movie, "The Passion", directed by Mel Gibson. On Friday, March 19<sup>th</sup> I will present the history of what lead up to the current controversy regarding the filming and release of the movie. Following my presentation, I invite congregants to discuss your concerns about the movie. While the movie is excruciatingly violent, the "Jewish mob" is depicted as being responsible for the death of Jesus. The Roman Catholic Vatican II statement clearly indicated that not all the Jews in Jesus' time were responsible for killing Jesus and that no Jews living today are responsible for Jesus' death. Nevertheless, the movie, "The Passion" is a retrograde attempt to once again incorrectly blame the Jews - and not Pontius Pilate and the Roman officials - for the death of Jesus.

As a young child the charge of killing Jesus marked the anti-semitic climate in which I grew up. I remember well when the second Vatican statement was published and how long it took children to "relearn" the story of how Jesus was arrested, put on trial, crucified and resurrected. For several decades, and up to this very time, progress has been made in Jewish-Christian dialogue on this issue. On a bi-weekly basis on Friday mornings in the library I teach a course on a "Jewish Understanding of the Greek Bible". Feel free to join us. I am concerned about how Jews will be understood and treated by others as a result of this movie. The movie, "The Passion", might very well have set back our understanding of the text and one another. Emotions and passions are running high with the release of this movie. I hope that ultimately it will lead to a better and more civil understanding of one another.

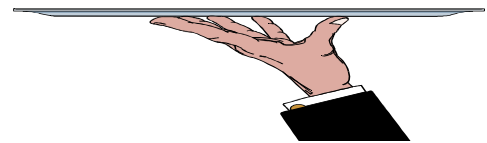
