CANTOR'S NOTES

I can't believe that the school year is almost over! The weather is warm and sunny and plans have been made for summer vacations and summer camp. At Temple Sinai, both choirs have been active. The *Cantor's Chanters* will be singing at the family service on May 14. They will also be taking a field trip with me to see the Connecticut Opera Company's version of *Little Red Riding Hood* at Tuckerman Hall on Sunday, May 16. The *Cantor's Chanters* had 20 members this year and were active in the High Holy Day, and Freedom services in addition to singing monthly at Family services. The choir ranges in age from Kindergarten through Sixth grade. I am very proud of them, not only for their musical achievements, but also for the way they have bonded over the years as a group. The older students help the younger ones find their parts in the music, and support them. They are a wonderful group of children, and Temple Sinai is blessed to have this group inspire others to sing.

On Friday night May 21, we will be having a very special Musical Shabbat featuring the *Halalisa Singers*. You have already gotten publicity about this special service. The *Halalisa Singers* will be singing a variety of Jewish songs, as well as leading us in the opening and closing songs. They are a wonderful group, and I'm sure you will all enjoy their participation. This service is open to the public as well as our own members, and of course, is free of charge. May 21 will be a special service for another reason as well. Catherine Walters Hebrew class will be leading the service. They have worked very hard preparing for this service, and I'm sure it will be a treat to hear them.

The *Evelyn Zarrow Choir* (Adult choir) will be doing something different next year. Instead of rehearsing three out of four Monday evenings and singing monthly, the choir will be singing at 3 or 4 selected services during the year. The thought is, that anyone who would like to sing, but cannot make a year-long commitment, will be able to choose a service and only come to those rehearsals which prepare for it. The choir will be singing for Rosh Hashanah evening, Yom Kippur morning, the Shabbat before Chanukah, the Shabbat during Passover, and possibly one additional service. There will be 4 or 5 rehearsals for each service which will enable the choir to focus only on that particular service. The choir is open to all Temple members, aged 13 and older. There will be two rehearsals this June to help prepare for the High Holy Days...June 7 and 21. A full schedule of rehearsals for next school year will be in the June and September bulletins. A WORD FROM THE STUDENT RABBI

"Make for yourself a *rav*/teacher; acquire for yourself a *chaver*/friend." (Pirkei Avot 1:6) When Rabbi Akiva began his studies he recognized the need for having both a teacher and a friend. The combination of the *rav* and the *chaver* were essential to the success of his studies. A *rav* helps a student to grow and continue growing. The *rav* comes with a deeper knowledge of the material and is therefore able to challenge, constructively critique, encourage, and respond to the needs or questions of the student. A *chaver* is a friend, a colleague, or a study partner. Since the *chaver* and the student are equal in their relationship, they are able to share their strengths and personal perspectives. They are also concerned about each other's emotional well-being and interests outside of their studies.

When I became part of the Temple Sinai community as a component of my rabbinical studies, I found both *rabanim* and *chaverim*. During this past year, the staff and members have taught me many valuable skills and information based on their expertise and interests. I have gained a broader insight into providing pastoral care, leading services, writing sermons and creating youth, family and adult education programs. I have also valued the questions and conversations that have challenged my perspective and helped me to learn new information.

During my time at Temple Sinai I have gained many *chaverim*. I have enjoyed getting to know the congregation through Shabbat dinners and Havdallah celebrations. At these meals I have built new friendships that have helped me to grow both as a person and as a rabbi.

I will be sad to say goodbye to the Sinai community during my final visit on the weekend of May 14 -16, but hopefully this will not be a final goodbye. I look forward to keeping in touch and hopefully one day studying together again. Thanks to everyone at Temple Sinai for being both my *rav* and *chaver*.

GRADE 7 MA'OT CHITIM PROJECT

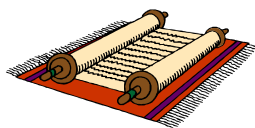
