"WHAT WE LEAVE TO ONE ANOTHER"

Hopefully, shortly after we celebrate Shavuot and Confirmation together on Tuesday evening, May 18, at 7:30 p.m., we will have the pleasure to welcome our guest, Rabbi Scott Saulson, to Temple Sinai and the Worcester Jewish Community, on the weekend of May 21-23. Elsewhere in the Bulletin you can find the details about Rabbi Saulson's program at Temple Sinai, on Sunday afternoon, May 23, beginning at 2:00 p.m. His topic for Shabbat evening, Friday, May 21 at 7:30 is, "Ethical Wills."

In our own families, there are times when we are the beneficiaries and recipients of gifts and legacies passed down to us from parents and grandparents. As Jews, not only do we receive material objects, but also the legacy of values and ideals that the older generation deemed important enough to bestow into our lives so that the best Jewish and human values will continue through us and into the future. There is a rich and deep Jewish tradition of spoken ethical wills, and even written ethical wills, in Jewish culture. On May 21, each of us is invited to spend the Shabbat evening thinking of what has been passed down to us in our families of origin and what we want to pass down to those who will follow us.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In the synagogue year 1957-1958, a group of people got together with a mission to create a small, intimate Reform Congregation in Worcester. They hired a rabbi, bought a building, and Temple Sinai was born. Last month, the Board of Temple Sinai spent a great deal of time considering our mission statement and reaffirming the sentiments embodied in past mission statements. With the announcement of Rabbi Bernstein's June 2011 retirement, we find ourselves poised on the brink of change. Wrapping our collective brains around a future that follows 25 years of Rabbi Seth Bernstein is a difficult and emotional process, but we will hunker down and move forward in a way that reflects the pride and ownership that we have for our Temple Sinai.

Being president of Temple Sinai, these past two years, has been an amazing and gratifying experience. When asked to take on the Presidency, I wondered how I could possibly rise to such a task. Board meetings, bulletin articles, building and grounds issues, contract negotiations, difficult decisions and conversations, finances, fund raising, and worry all swirled in my head. Overriding all that, though, was my love and devotion to this Temple Sinai Community and to its success and continuity. And so, with the support of my family and working with an excellent executive board, board of trustees, staff, and entire community we have passed through two more years. I am confident that Gary Englander will do a beautiful job leading us in the coming years.

I have gained proficiency at many things such as dragging brush, feeding a wood chipper, climbing ladders, inspecting the roof, asking for money (even though it was a misplaced decimal point, is \$420,000 really too much to hope for in a High Holiday Appeal?), learning to keep perspective, and in savoring this whole experience.

I thank you all for placing your trust in me these past two years and I can only say that even though my presidential pop-up timer has gone off, I am still cookin' and look forward to the Temple Sinai future that we all have together.

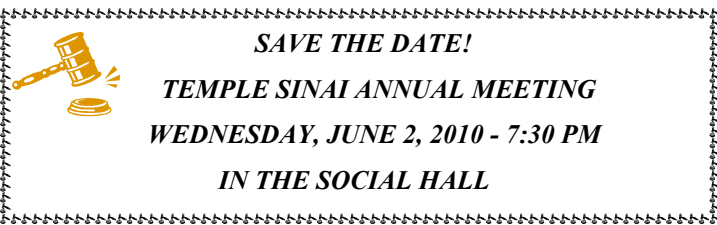
NOTES FROM KIM
