“THERE IS NO SUCH THING AS TOO MUCH JOY”

We have recently entered a new Hebrew month, Mar Heshvan. It is a month that means “the eighth month” (as does October in the secular calendar). This year the Jewish eighth month overlaps with November, more or less. The Hebrew word mar literally means “month” and the word, “Heshvan,” is the Babylonian name for “eight”, hence the name Mar Heshvan, the eighth month of the Hebrew calendar.

The Rabbis toyed with the name Mar Heshvan suggesting that the month, Heshvan, is mar or bitter - as in the maror or horseradish on the Passover plate - because there is no festival in the month and so our month is bitter. (The ancient Rabbis did not know of Thanksgiving!).

I just got off the phone speaking to a rabbinic colleague who returned from his granddaughter’s consecration in another city. As he said so correctly, “you can never celebrate too much with loved ones.” Be it festivals or life cycle events, Jews know how to celebrate the joyous occasions of life. That is why Jews have fixed times in our calendars to celebrate life’s happy and fun-filled moments. But joy can come into our lives, not because of the calendar, but because we have made an effort to bring joy into our lives and the lives of others.

This synagogue year we celebrate the beginning of a new program at Temple Sinai, “Joys of Judaism”. It is a series of lay-led activities by temple members. Recently at Simchat Torah, Maile Jones inaugurated the first such event by leading congregants in Israeli dancing at the Oneg Shabbat and Yom Tov that followed our Simchat Torah service. We applaud Maile and the other members of the Joy of Judaism committee for initiating this program. It is under the auspices of the Adult Education Committee, chaired by Steve Soreff. We look forward to countless times when we can rejoice with one another - be they part of the temple’s calendar or program or if they just happen spontaneously. There is no such thing as too much joy. As the Hebrew expression goes, “Simcha v’sasson - sasson v’simcha. May gladness and joy be unconfined in our lives”.

May the joy of Judaism warm our spirits and delight our hearts as we continue to go into our synagogue year.

Dear Michael, Board and Congregation,

I owe you all my deepest gratitude for the love and kindness you have shown me during the Yamim Noraim. It is always difficult to lose a loved one, no matter the circumstances, and especially hard for that loss to be right before a holiday. As you know, my father died the morning of September 26, and I found out about it only hours before the Rosh Hashanah eve service. My dad was in a hospice, and therefore the death was not unexpected. Nevertheless, death always seems to come as a shock. Rabbi Bernstein knew of my father's passing immediately after I did, as he was in the building when I received the call from my sister Carol in New Jersey. We both made the decision to let the congregation know after services on Rosh Hashanah evening.

After the Rosh Hashanah evening service I received hugs and condolences from just about everyone in the congregation. I cannot express what that has meant to me and to my family. Just knowing that the Temple Sinai family is with me at this difficult time has taken a great weight off my shoulders, given me great consolation, and enabled me to get through the Holy Days. I want you and the entire congregation to know how special Temple Sinai is...what *mensch*es you all are, and how fortunate and blessed I am to be a part of this community.

In the next few days, I will of course, be writing thank you notes to everyone who has written condolences to me, or made donations in my father's name, but meanwhile, I just want you to know how I feel. May the New Year bring blessings to you, your families, and all those you hold dear.

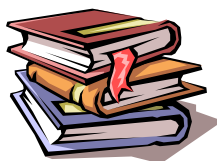

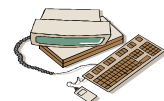
