DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

"HAND HELD"

My calendar and address book, my personal contacts with the outside world, were all contained in an electronic device by the name of "hand held." My hand held device was even replete with a full-size keyboard for taking notes. Yesterday, quite suddenly, and with the chutzpah of not asking permission, my hand held device stopped working, kaput. At the present time I am scrambling to try to figure out what new device to acquire so that I can keep my appointments and stay in contact with people with as seamless an adjustment as is possible.

I should have known from the onset that a device with the name "hand held," a passive participle of "hand hold," was headed for extinction. Like most of us, we need to be able to hold onto what is dear to us right now, in the present moment, before it slips through our finger tips. Or as Herman Melville expressed it so beautifully in Moby Dick, "I like a good grip; I like to feel something in this slippery world that can hold." Even Ahab had the desire for what is "hand hold" and not "hand held."

Holding hands is so basic to the demonstration of affection between people. The touch of a hand and the feeling that we have made a connection with another person are critical manifestations of our social lives with other human beings. To hold and to be held are necessary aspects of our lives so that we can feel loved, get along with other people, and build affirming and lasting relationships. But there can be pauses along the way when it might be prudent to refrain from holding hands just now.

In the present world of H1-N1, and with all the precautions that are necessary to prevent the spread of infection, it is more than prudent to go through a "hand held" period when we have to be more guarded about our personal touch with others. Certainly in the future we will be able to embrace and be embraced by our loved ones, but the healthy choice is to be more cautious of just how free we are about extending hands to all at the present time.

Recently Harry Hubbard, our member of the Board and Chair of our Security Committee, and I met with city government officials and other members of our faith communities on the flu situation in Worcester. There might be times in the months ahead that we have to do more at Temple Sinai than to have protective hand gel in every classroom or refrain from reception lines, but that is yet to be seen. In the meantime, hold your loved one tenderly and be thankful for the moment that you can touch each other's CLEAN hand. May you enjoy Thanksgiving in the best of health.

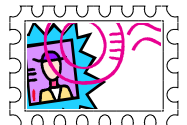
