DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

"AS THE NEW YEAR BEGINS: RESPONDING TO HUNGER AND HOMELESSNESS"

This bulletin comes into your hands at the beginning of October during the Yamim Noraim, the ten days of repentance between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. These are the days when we muster our inner resolve to make ourselves—and our world—better. Perhaps we use these days best by doing what is good for those in need.

On Yom Kippur we are asking our members to bring canned goods to the sanctuary building. In keeping with the words of Isaiah, the Haftarah portion of that day, "Is this the fast that I have chosen?"-- our temple members are given the opportunity to offer food to the hungry. A barrel will be set outside the back of the temple by the kitchen door where canned good can be left. The food items, that will be placed in a large barrel, will be given through Rachel's Table to benefit recipients from the Worcester County Food Bank.

At the very end of October, Friday night October 31, I will speak on the subject, "When the Homeless Aren't at Home on Halloween". Homelessness still plagues our area. Families and individuals in the Worcester area still cannot find adequate housing that is affordable.

For six years, this congregation has been part of the effort to house homeless families in December as part of the Interfaith Hospitality Network. Dozens of volunteers from our temple do a tremendous service when we annually help out with this program. Presently, the Interfaith Hospitality Network is in difficult financial straits. Each IHN sponsoring institution is being asked to sponsor one event to benefit IHN. On October 31, our Oneg Shabbat will be dedicated to the work of the Interfaith Hospitality Network. In anticipation of that evening's program, temple members are being asked to send a check to Temple Sinai to help sponsor the Interfaith Hospitality Program. The check is to be made payable to "Rabbi's Discretionary Fund" and in the lower left of the check to write "IHN". Our social action chair is Wendy Rickles and Temple Sinai's coordinator with the Interfaith Hospitality Network is Copi Eder. We are grateful for all that they and the host of volunteers do throughout the year to help those in need.

Elsewhere in this bulletin, our president, Michael Wolpert, is writing about the new tzedakah box mounted in the lobby of the sanctuary building. In this way, too, individuals can respond to those in need. As we go from the Days of Awe to the days of Sukkot and beyond, I hope we will do all that we can to make a better world for ourselves and those in need.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

One of the most basic tenets of Judaism, at least the Judaism that I was brought up with, is that of Tzedakah. The members of Temple Sinai continually demonstrate the principle of Tzedakah throughout the year, with a variety of programs such as the Inter-faith Hospitality Network, our historical support for the HEART program, and various activities that are coordinated by Wendy Rickles and the Social Action committee.

Our students are asked to demonstrate their commitment to this principle through the programs coordinated by the religious school as well as some of the community service programs that they undergo while preparing for their B'Nai Mitzvah. Clearly, this is an important concept that speaks to the essence of who we are as both a community, as well as who we are as individuals.

Until now, however, there has not been a formal method for collecting and distributing Tzedakah from our members. Thanks in part to an anonymous donation, the Board was asked to install a Tzedakah box in the synagogue building. Thanks to the artistic efforts of Leon Nigrosh and Lewis Shepard, we now have a beautiful addition to the foyer of a Tzedakah box that actually doubles as a piece of artwork. Leon has fashioned this piece as a chaff of wheat, the symbolic significance of which reminds us of festival food.

The Board has voted to donate this money to a charitable organization on a quarterly basis. Please note that in no event will this money be used within the operating budget of Temple Sinai. The intent of this project is to collect and direct funds to truly charitable causes both inside as well as outside the Jewish community.

I would like to personally thank all of the individuals who have been involved in this project, from the collection of the funds, to the design and manufacture of the piece. I look forward to this being a successful project throughout the years, and to seeing that Temple Sinai always reflects the importance of this most basic Jewish ideal.

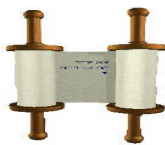
