"WHAT TO DO ABOUT YOUR OWN SPIRITUALITY"

The High Holy Days are behind us and we find ourselves in the midst of the Sukkot holiday. The reality of the concerns of every day life returns whenever we build our Sukkah. Just when the leaves change their color we face everyday life filled with harsh realities and spiritual opportunities. We hope the spiritual uplift of the holiday season will strengthen and guide us as we go forward toward new spiritual growth.

I am embarking on a new spiritual quest. Recently I was accepted into the Rabbinic Program of the Institute for Jewish Spirituality. It is a two year program centered upon two five day retreats each year for thirty-five rabbis to "find structure, support and guidance for their own spiritual growth and, upon this foundation, helps them develop as spiritual guides and teachers for others." In between these retreats and throughout the two years of study, we will explore the nature of self and God through a variety of Jewish kabbalistic, hasidic and musar traditions as well as modern thought.

While I look forward to cultivating dimensions of the human spirit such as openheartedness, love of God, awe, restraint, equanimity and joy, I look forward to cultivating the relationships with those rabbis with whom I will be in relationship. Spirituality is just one part of life and it, too, needs cultivation and nourishment. I am so excited that I will be able to pursue this endeavor with rabbinic colleagues from across the spectrum of denominations and movements of American Judaism. Among the colleagues with whom I will be learning and sharing will be Rabbis Nancy Flam, Arthur Green, Shefa Gold, Michael Strassfeld and others.

Rabbis, cantors, and educators have no hold on Jewish spirituality or on spirituality in general. Opportunities abound to increase our understanding and appreciation of the spiritual dimensions of our lives. Spiritual endeavors of this kind are not limited to Jewish professionals. As we go forward into the new year may the spiritual directions of our lives improve by dint of our own efforts.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

While pondering an appropriate message for this High Holiday season, I came across the following vignette from Jewish Spirituality, by Rabbi Bernard S. Raskas, which I'd like to share with you:

"The seventh day of the festival of Sukkot is known as Hoshana Rabbah, 'the great saving'. Yom Kippur is the Day of Atonement, but so great is the compassion of God that if there are any sins left to be forgiven they can be redeemed on Hoshana Rabbah. It is a way of saying that the gates of mercy are never closed.

The principle behind Hoshana Rabbah represents a very important insight into human nature. We do not suddenly turn over a new leaf. It takes time and patience to develop a new orientation and to withdraw from old habits. Hoshana Rabbah is highly realistic. It says to us: Never despair. If you took two steps forward yesterday and you fell one step back today, you are still ahead by one. A mistake is only a mistake, it is not the final defeat."

Open the door of repentance only the width of the eye of a needle and God will open it wide enough for carriages and wagons to pass through.- SONG OF SONGS RABBAH, CHAPTER 5

What struck me the most about this message is that we really do have until Hoshana Rabbah, or the last day of Sukkot, to change our ways, although it is most important to reflect upon and accept our sins of the past year on Yom Kippur. In this passage, God is akin to a loving and patient parent, willing to "bend a bit" for those of us who need a little extra time to clean the slate from last year. This passage is also extremely optimistic, because during this season we have additional time to admit our mistakes and transgressions to God, family, friends, and colleagues, ask for forgiveness, and know that things will be all right in the end.

During this season of reflection and repentance, let's all resolve to do better next year. Temple Sinai offers us many tools to do this. Whether it is becoming more spiritual, forging a deeper connection with God, being a better role model to our children, or increasing our knowledge of Judaism, Temple Sinai is here to help. Our Friday night Shabbat services, Saturday morning Torah study, and Adult Education programs are just a few offerings available here for you.

Additionally, members who have been tardy in response to our High Holiday Appeal do still have a chance-and we appreciate your generosity greatly!

So then let's hope that we all take more steps forwards than backward this year, and may time and patience be on our side.
