DIVREI HALEV WORDS OF THE HEART

"AS WE ARE ABOUT TO BEGIN A NEW YEAR"

It was a September morning some years ago. A Jewish father and his son stood in line at a college in New England. Just for a moment the father stood there, wanting to say so many things, but saying only one: "Son, never forget who you are." Worth more than a score of lectures on behavior was that one statement. What should be the one statement that we say to the children of our synagogue as we are about to begin a new spiritual year?

How do we make our children, who are our physical heirs, our spiritual heirs as well? How do we transmit to them our Jewish values? Since the time of Abraham and Sarah, the first Jews, this has been the abiding concern of every Jewish parent. How can we insure that the next generation will follow a Jewish path?

Firstly, we must take our children to the synagogue with us or do whatever we can so that the synagogue is as welcoming as possible to children. We must practice Judaism with them. We must observe the holidays with them. We must perform the mitzvot with them. We must give the children of our community a faith, a commitment, and ideal to follow. We - as parents and as adults - must show them what is genuinely Jewish and truly humane.

Secondly, we must give our children the best Jewish education possible. We are grateful for the efforts of our Religious School Principal, Wendy Wong, the Religious School Staff and Religious School Committee whose hard work and diligent service help each of our children embrace our spiritual heritage.

Thirdly, we must cultivate in our children and in ourselves the willingness to make sacrifices for our beliefs and values. The Jews of previous generations, our ancestors, were willing to deny themselves not only to comforts of life, but the necessities of life, to make sure that the synagogue and the Jewish school and the institutions of the Jewish community had sufficient means for their needs.

Lastly, we must provide for our children a genuine Jewish atmosphere in which they will see other children - their friends and peers - studying and practicing Judaism. "Train up a child in the way he should go, and even when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverb 22:16) Of course, there are no guarantees in life. But, I do think that as we begin the new year we should keep before us the verse from Proverbs. It is one good statement for each and every one of us. To you and your loved ones, L'shanah Tovah Tikateivu.
